RAVANIAH GAJJALA



Ravaniah is 60 years old. He married a widow who had 3 children. When his wife died 2 years ago his children abandoned him because he has leprosy. His own brothers treated him badly and left him for destitute. He has been a leper now for 15 years. He lives all alone and cooks for himself. His leprosy began with numbness in the left hand. He used to make garlands with flowers but his leprosy has limited the use of his hands. Now he pulls a rickshaw cart for transporting cement bags to earn a meager living, as well as picking rags. One day he fell down from the bicycle and hurt his hip for which he was told he needs surgery. The local Christian community has been compassionate on him. They have helped him in times of need. He loves Jesus and looks to God to be his provider and healer. Ravaniah's prayers are for healing of his legs and hands, for daily food and that he would live with gratitude all the days of his life.

We are currently raising funds for the 25 families at the leper colony so they can

have small homes. Each home in the leper colony costs \$3,000 if you would like to help Ravaniah as well as the others at the leper colony have a home then please respond in the tear off portion below. Thank you to those who have already donated, we have raised \$17,000 so far.
