## SEEING THE NEED AND STEPPING IN

A few years back many of you responded to the needs of several leprosy families whose homes were heartlessly bulldozed by the landowner. We put their story in one of our newsletters and raised enough funds to buy them land of their own. Over the past few years the 25 different families have lived in temporary, thatch shelters each costing \$250. These shelters are not permanent and have been replaced often due to the harsh weather.

Permanent homes made of concrete are but just a dream for these families at the leper colony. The reality of their yearly income is so bleak that they will never be able to afford the \$3,000 it costs to build a permanent home.

PJ, a team member on our June trip, saw first hand the plight of the people in the leprosy village and he took a step of faith to try and raise funds to build homes for these families. In the last 2 months he has rallied five different families from North Dakota to contribute \$15,000 of the \$75,000 needed. As PJ said, "The people in the leprosy village have little or no hope of a better life. No business people will hire them. Society shuns them. Their plight is worse than that of an orphaned child". ## FENCE UPDATE

Since we shared our need for a fence at the orphanage, we have raised \$50,000 of the \$70,000 needed. Every month we praise God for the funds coming in to secure the orphanage property with a block fence. The fence will keep water buffalos and other livestock out, it will help the children and widows feel secure. It will also eliminate our cobra problems. We plan to start building the wall, portion by portion, until all the funds come in. Thank you to those who have donated to the fence and for your prayers for our orphans and widows in India.
